The new Washington State Office of Equity is gathering collective wisdom for a five-year strategic plan to help our state bridge opportunity gaps and reduce disparities. WDFW is embarking on a journey with the Governor's newly created Office of Equity, along with other state agencies, to ensure equitable and just outcomes for all Washingtonians and to help us to reframe our work to bridge gaps and reduce disparities.
