Chair Carpenter called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

1. Call to Order

a. Commissioners' Discussion

Wildlife Committee

Commissioner Thorburn reported that the committee discussed <u>Science in management</u>, accounting for risk and uncertainty and was provided a briefing on the Land Recreation plan.

Fish Committee

Commissioner McIsaac reported that the committee discussed the Non-Native Game Fish and Fisheries Policy and potential draft language. An update on the P-3624 Hatchery Policy briefing on progress developing the technical procedures document and a brief discussion on the Cowlitz River Hooking Mortality Study. Under additional discussion staff provided an update on Coastal Steelhead Town Hall Meetings.
