### PUGET SOUND SHRIMP BEAM TRAWL LOG

This harvest log is prepared by the Department of Fish and Wildlife to conform to the requirements of Washington Administrative Code 220-52-075 requiring harvest logs to be maintained and returned to the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

THE INFORMATION GIVEN IN THIS LOG IS CONSIDERED PRIVILEGED AND WILL NOT BE USED TO DISCLOSE FISHING ACTIVITIES OF ANY INDIVIDUAL.

Use of this harvest log does not remove the responsibility to complete a State of Washington Shellfish Receiving Ticket when the shrimp are sold.

### **INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE**

- 1. Catch data must be recorded on the harvest log after each tow
- 2. Harvest logs shall be signed, dated, and returned to the WDFW Port Townsend Office, 375 Hudson Street, Port Townsend, WA 98368, at the end of each calendar month, to be received by the 10<sup>th</sup> of the following month unless required otherwise by emergency regulation. If you did not fish during the month, it is not necessary to submit a harvest log.
- 3. Write all information clearly and legibly.
- 4. WDFW Boat Registration number is the five digit boat number assigned to you by the Department of Fish and Wildlife (not the US Coast Guard reg. number).
- 5. Trawl Information: Make a separate entry for each tow EXCEPT in the last three columns headed "Date Sold", "Actual Pounds Sold", and Shellfish Receiving Ticket No.". Here you need only make one entry, entering the date actual pounds of shrimp sold and shellfish receiving ticket no. on the day of sale.
- 6. Today's date refers to each day that you are actually on the water operating your gear.
- 7. Fishing Location: Please make a separate entry for each area fished and each tow. Use Marine Fish/Shellfish Catch Area designations provided AND nearest landmark (point of land, bay, cove, town, etc.).
- 8. Report the latitude and longitude to the nearest tenth or hundredth of a minute, at the beginning of each tow.
- 9. Estimated Catch: Estimate catch by species for each tow. Include ONLY the catch retained, and NOT shrimp returned to the water except for spot shrimp. Record estimated lbs. of spot shrimp released in the SPOTS RELEASED column. This is the live weight, i.e. heads on before cooking.
- 10. Shellfish Receiving Ticket Number: Enter the Shellfish Ticket serial number in the appropriate row on the day of sale.
