WASHINGTON COASTAL DUNGENESS CRAB INDUSTRY NOTICE

Season Opening Delayed in Washington, Oregon, and California (North of Point Arena)

On November 18, 2022, coastal Dungeness crab Tri-State policy representatives from the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW), the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) agreed to delay the opening of the 2022-23 Coastal Dungeness crab fishery from Point Arena, California north to the US/Canada border through at least December 15th. This decision was based on crab condition tests conducted by WDFW, ODFW, and CDFW which shows that test results at multiple sites across the region do not currently meet the minimum meat recovery criteria.

The Tri-State Dungeness Crab Pre-Season Testing Protocols specify that after the first round of testing, if any area does not meet the minimum meat recovery criteria (23% north of Cascade Head and 24% south of Cascade Head) a delay is required, and additional testing is conducted before a season opening date can be confirmed. Additionally, the protocol also recommends that each test site should have at least 300 pounds of crab. A second round of both meat recovery and domoic acid testing is scheduled to be conducted in early December. WDFW will provide additional information regarding the season opening as soon as possible following the completion of the upcoming tests.

WASHINGTON TEST RESULTS

The stations in the Long Beach Test Area were completed on November 9, 2022, and the stations in the Westport Test Area were completed on November 14, 2022. The results for all stations are summarized below.

Definition of shell grades:

- 1A: no flex in body or legs; marketable
- 1B: slight flex in either body or leg; marketable
- II: some flex in both body and leg; not marketable
- III: extreme flex in body and legs; not marketable
