ALERTS

An invasive algae: Ahnfeltiopsis flabelliformis

This invasive seaweed (marine algae) is fan-shaped and typically dark red with lighter-colored tips or shoots. It grows in concentrations of bushy tufts less than 4 inches tall typically found in the middle to lower intertidal zone attached to hard surfaces such as rocks and shells.
