A petition that asks the commission to begin rule making for the 2024 recreational spring bear hunting season.
Presenter(s):

Background summary:
This petition differs slightly from the petitions that you have already denied from this petitioner. In this petition, the petitioner is asking for rulemaking on a 2024 recreational spring black bear hunting season. The past petitions have asked for a management related spring black bear hunting season. The petitioner argues that the Commission motion on November 18, 2022, that informed Department staff and the public that the Commission will not adopt recreational hunting of black bear in the Spring, should be invalid due to procedural missteps. Since that vote has not been revisited or changed, Department staff do not feel it would be appropriate to consider a season that would go against the Commission's policy direction.
Staff recommendation:
Department staff recommend denying this petition as it contradicts the Commission's policy direction on this matter.
Policy issue(s) and expected outcome:
If this petition is denied no rule making will take place to contemplate a 2024 spring black bear recreational hunting season.
Fiscal impacts of agency implementation:
The fiscal impact of this decision is minimal and is not different from the status quo, based on commission direction.
