The following action was taken:

<i>2023 Mainstem Columbia River Spring Chinook Recreational Fishery</i>		
<b>Downstream of Bonneville Dam</b>		
<b>Season:</b>	Friday May 19 through Wednesday May 24	6 days
<b>Area:</b>	Tongue Point/Rocky Point line upstream to Beacon Rock (boat and bank) plus bank angling only from Beacon Rock upstream to the Bonneville Dam deadline. Legal upstream boat boundary defined as: A deadline marker on the Oregon bank (approximately four miles downstream from Bonneville Dam Powerhouse One) in a straight line through the western tip of Pierce Island to a deadline marker on the Washington bank at Beacon Rock.	
<b>Daily Bag Limit:</b>	Two adult hatchery salmonids (Chinook or steelhead) per day, but only one may be a Chinook.	
	All other permanent regulations apply.	
<b>Bonneville Dam to Oregon/Washington Border</b>		
<b>Season:</b>	Friday May 19 through Wednesday May 24	6 days
<b>Area:</b>	Tower Island power lines (approximately six miles below The Dalles Dam) upstream to Oregon/Washington border, plus the Oregon and Washington banks between Bonneville Dam and the Tower Island power lines.	
<b>Daily Bag Limit:</b>	Two adult hatchery salmonids (Chinook or steelhead) per day, but only one may be a Chinook.	
	All other permanent regulations apply.
