Purpose of Game Management Plans

- Guide the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife's management of hunted wildlife.
- Provide the public an opportunity to weigh-in through a formal process on high level game management issues.
- Identify data gaps and future research and monitoring needs.
- Identify existing and potential limiting factors affecting game populations.
- Give broad direction on addressing known limiting factors.
- Provide a basis for work planning.
- Identify funding needs.
- Provide direction on sustainable hunting management recommendations.



Slightly Modified Path Forward

- <u>Current GMP will not be renewed and will be allowed</u>
 <u>to expire</u>
- <u>The new GMP will be written as one document and</u> <u>undergo the appropriate SEPA Review</u>
- Commission will contemplate policy considerations that may inform or supersede the GMP
- Wildlife Committee/Commission will provide case appropriate review during the internal review process prior to public SEPA review
- The GMP is not action hunts go thru Commission Rulemaking process, GMP content informs and guides resource allocation



Progress

- Drafted and internally vetted issue statements for GMP
- Drafted, refined, and categorized Guiding Principles
- Reviewed alternative format and content proposals
- Drafted Possible Policy language
- Drafted and refining Agency and Commission Authorities
- Drafted and refining Overarching Issue statements
- Drafted Waterfowl and Migratory Game Bird Chapter
- Process for tracking progress internally and externally



Refined Policy Topics

- 1. Game Species Conservation Principles
- 2. Carnivore hunting policy
- 3. Structuring sustainable hunting opportunity and providing guidance regarding how to maximize public recreational hunting opportunities in the full context of RCW 77.04.012 and associated legislation
- 4. Potential topic: Furbearer/Beaver management



Next steps

- Continue working with the Wildlife Committee on the policy topics
- Present Issue Statements for GMP to the Wildlife Committee as chapters are being drafted
- Continue working with Wildlife Committee to identify additional policy topics in subsequent chapters
- Internal plan review including Wildlife Committee
- Comply with SEPA process
- Seek Commission approval on plan when completed
