## **DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)**

Name of Proposal: DNS 23-034: RECLASSIFY THE WESTERN GRAY SQUIRREL

FROM THREATENED TO ENDANGERED IN THE STATE OF

WASHINGTON

## **Description of Proposal:**

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) proposes to reclassify the western gray squirrel from Threatened in the state of Washington to Endangered under authority described in WAC 220-610-110.

WDFW bases its proposal to reclassify western gray squirrel to Endangered on scientific information contained in its report *Periodic Status Review for the Western Gray Squirrel*. This report summarizes evidence that the western gray squirrel population is threatened with extinction in the state with more than 20% habitat decline in the core of its range since it was originally listed as Threatened. The report recommends that the species be reclassified as an Endangered species.

Although not well documented, western gray squirrels were probably once uncommon to locally common across much of their range in Washington. The species was in decline by the late 1800s and was considered rare by 1970. In 2007, the statewide population was estimated to be between 468 and 1,405 squirrels (937  $\pm$  50%) based on data from 1994-2005. Populations have not been estimated since, but occupancy surveys were conducted 2018-2020 to establish a baseline for monitoring trends in coming years.
