

European green crabs are NOT always green!

The European green crab (Carcinus maenas) is a damaging invasive species that poses a threat to nativeshellfish and habitat for salmon and many other species. These shore crabs are found in less than 25 feet of water often in estuaries, mudflats, and intertidal zones. They are not likely to be caught in deeper water, but may be encountered by beach anglers, waders, clam and oyster harvesters, or those crabbing off docks or piers in shallow areas.
