## **Shorelands and Environmental Assistance Program-Floodplains**

The West Little Walla Walla River Restoration is within the boundaries 100-year floodplain. A Floodplain Development Permit (FDP) will be required, Application for the FDP will be made available through and processed by the Floodplain Administrator at Walla Walla County. The FDP must be received prior to commencing with development activities.
