WAC 232-30-250 Provisions for accidental take by falconers.

All Sensitive, Threatened, Endangered, and Candidate Species (Species of Concern) take must be reported using the Falconry Accidental Take Report card. Please see <a href="http://wdfw.wa.gov/conservation/endangered/All/">http://wdfw.wa.gov/conservation/endangered/All/</a> for a list of these species. Also, report all quarry

Please keep your Accidental Take Report card with you when hunting.

## Summary of the regulation

- If your falconry raptor captures any quarry out of season the animal must be released if it is not seriously injured.
- If the animal is seriously injured or killed you may not take the carcass but your raptor may feed on it at the site.
- If the animal is a state Species of Concern (see above) or a Federally listed Threatened or Endangered (T or E) animal you must record all the required information on the card before you leave the site.
- Report all T & E species to the US Fish and Wildlife Service also.
- Please send in reports of all Species of Concern and Federal T&E takes immediately but they must be reported by April 1 following the close of the current hunting season or within 10 days if not during the hunting season. Mail to FALCONRY MANAGER, WDFW, 16018 MILL CREEK BLVD, MILL CREEK, WA 98012.
- You must cease hunting for the day if your raptor takes any Species of Concern or Federal T&E species.
- Accidental kills of any combination of Species of Concern or Federal T&E species may not exceed a total of five in any license year.
