DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)

Name of Proposal: DNS 24-036: MIMA CREEK ACCESS AND PARKING

Description of Proposal:

WDFW proposes to improve recreational access at the Black River Unit of the Scatter Creek Wildlife Area located off Gate Rd SW in Olympia, Washington. We propose to construct a 40 ft x 50 ft gravel parking area with a culvert, entrance apron, gate that leads to a leased field that is mowed, barbed wire fence around the parking area (approximately 140 linear ft), and one 6 ft x 8 ft informational kiosk. The culvert and entrance apron will be sized based on Thurston County requirements. This parking area will provide access for hunting, wildlife viewing, and other recreational uses, as well as improve safety on Gate Rd. Currently, vehicles park on the shoulder when accessing the site, which is a safety concern for vehicles traveling Gate Rd.

Location of Proposal, including street, if any: Black River Unit of the WDFW Scatter Creek Wildlife Area. The project is located near 9158 Gate Road, Olympia, Thurston County, Washington: Township 16N, Range 3W, Section 17.

Lead Agency: Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW)
