DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)

Name of Proposal: DNS 24-040: WENAS BULL PASTURE ROAD SEASONAL

CLOSURE

Description of Proposal:

WDFW proposes to seasonally close motorized use for approximately 5 miles of the Bull Pasture Green Dot Road located in Yakima County. Signage including maps of the section seasonal closed will be posted at each entrance of the green dot road and 2 gates will be installed to restrict motorized access during the closure period. Walk in access for hunting, hiking, horseback riding or other forms of recreation in the area will remain open during the motorized closed season. The closure will prevent and protect the surrounding environment and wildlife from damage caused by off-road motorized use during winter and early spring months when soils are muddy. It will have a positive impact by protecting the overall quality of the road, which the users will appreciate during the months the road will remain open for use, especially during big game hunting seasons.

After review it appears that the proposal meets the SEPA exemption in WAC 197-11-800((5)(c), but WDFW is proceeding with a SEPA review anyway for transparency and notification.

Location of Proposal, including street, if any: Bull Pasture Road on the WDFW Wenas Wildlife Area, approximately 9 miles north of Selah, Yakima County, Washington: Township 15N, Range 18E, Sections 16, 17, 20, 21, and 27.
