

Winter steelhead citizen science opportunity

WDFW is seeking anglers to assist with collecting scale samples from natural-origin winter steelhead in Southwest Washington.

How it works



- During normal angling and under existing permanent rules seasons, participating anglers are asked to collect scale samples from incidentally caught natural-origin winter steelhead with intact adipose and ventral fins.
- Sampling will take place between Jan. 1 and March 15, 2025, or until the listed closure dates for specific waterbodies.

Priority sampling locations

- Grays River
- Abernathy Creek
- Coweeman River

- Elochoman River
- Germany Creek
- East Fork Lewis River

- Skamokawa Creek
 South Fork Toutle River
 Washougal River
- Mill Creek
- Green River (NF Toutle)

Other waterbodies in Southwest Washington are also included, with the exception of the Cowlitz, North Fork Lewis, and Kalama river systems.

Angler requirements

- · Participants must supply their own fishing equipment.
- · WDFW will provide all scale sampling materials.
- Participants are responsible for following fishing regulations and local, state, and federal laws, such as respecting private property.
- WDFW will not be liable for any loss or damage to personal gear.
