Allowable	Sturgeon from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool and from 43 to 54	
Sales:	inches fork length in The Dalles and John Day pools may be kept for subsistence purposes. Sturgeon within the legal-size limits and caught in the platform and hook and line fishery may only be sold only if caught during the open period and open Pool of an open setline fishery. Fish landed during the open periods are allowed to be sold after the period concludes.

more than 24 hours.
