DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)

Name of Proposal: DNS 25-006: MIDDLE AND WEST FOSTER CREEKS RIPARIAN

RESTORATION

Description of Proposal:

WDFW proposes to restore individual reaches of West Foster Creek and Middle Foster Creek by installing beaver dam analogs (BDAs), post assisted log structure (PALS), and Zeedyk rock structures. These creeks are in Douglas County on the Sagebrush Flat and Wells wildlife areas. The creeks have incised channels and headcuts due to numerous flood events that occurred in the 20th Century. The project goal is to stop the incision process, improve water quality, water retention, and stream habitat, plus reconnect the creeks to their floodplain and improve the health and diversity of the surrounding riparian vegetation community.

Up to 30 CY of off-site rock may be used for instream rock structures. Material used for BDA construction will consist of tree limbs, weed free straw, wood chips, untreated wood posts, plus vegetation, dirt, and rocks collected from the creekbed and vicinity.

Location of Proposal: Two locations in Douglas County, Washington:

- West Foster Creek, Bridgeport Unit of the WDFW Sagebrush Flat Wildlife Area and West Foster Creek Unit of the WDFW Wells Wildlife Area, approximately 4 miles south of Bridgeport: Township 28N, Range 25E, Sections 2, 10, 11, 15, and 16.
- Middle Foster Creek, Bridgeport Unit of the WDFW Sagebrush Flat Wildlife Area, approximately 5 miles south of Bridgeport: Township 28N, Range 25E, Section 15.

Lead Agency: Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW)

WDFW has determined that this proposal will not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment and that an environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c).
