Allowed Sales	Yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish, carp, and northern pikeminnow may be
	sold. These species may be sold after the permit fishing period concludes. All
	other species including salmon, steelhead and sturgeon must be released.
Additional	24-hour quick reporting is required for Washington buyers, pursuant to WAC

Non-Treaty Recreational

2025 John Day Pool Recreational Sturgeon Fishery

Effective 11:59 PM Thursday, March 13 the retention of sturgeon is prohibited in the mainstem Columbia River from John Day Dam upstream to McNary Dam (John Day Pool) and all adjacent tributaries.

Non-Treaty Commercial

2025 Mainstem Commercial Smelt Fishery

Season: Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays (5 AM to 5 PM) March 17 through March

27 (6 periods)

Area: Zones 1-3

Gear: Gillnet only. Mesh size may not exceed two inches stretch measure. Nets may not

exceed 1,500 feet in length along the cork line.

Allowable Smelt

Sales:

Misc. Multiple net rule in effect. Nets not specifically authorized for use in this fishery may be onboard the vessel if properly stored. A properly stored net is defined as

a net on a drum that is fully covered by a tarp (canvas or plastic) and bound with a minimum of ten revolutions of rope with a diameter of 3/8 (0.375) inches or

greater.

24-hour quick reporting required for Washington buyers, pursuant to WAC 220-

352-315.

Oregon buyers are required to electronically submit fish receiving tickets pursuant to OAR 635-006-0210. Electronic fish tickets must be submitted within 24 hours of closure of the fishing period, or within 24 hours of landing for fishing periods

lasting more than 24 hours.
