Columbia River and Tributary Fishery Reports

Lower Columbia River, Rocky Point/Tongue Point line upstream to Bonneville Dam – 32 salmonid boats and 15 Washington bank rods were tallied between Warrior Rock and Longview Bridge on the effort count Saturday 3/15.

Mainstem Columbia River

Salmon/Steelhead

Sec 1 (Bonneville) – No report.

Sec 2 (Camas/Washougal) – No report.

Sec 3 (I-5 area) – No bank effort reported. 1 boat/2 rods had no catch.

Sec 4 (Vancouver) – Seven bank anglers had no catch. 15 boats/26 rods kept one Chinook.

Sec 5 (Woodland) – Four bank anglers had no catch. 9 boats/15 rods had no catch.

Sec 6 (Kalama) – 7 bank anglers had no catch. 1 boat/1 rod had no catch.

Sec 7 (Cowlitz) – No bank effort reported. 1 boat/3 rods had no catch.

Sec 8 (Longview) – 22 bank anglers released two steelhead. 31 boats/69 rods kept one steelhead.

Sec 9 (Cathlamet) – 16 bank anglers had no catch. 3 boats/11 rods kept one Chinook.

Sec 10 (Cathlamet) – No bank effort reported. 20 boats/41 rods had no catch.

Columbia River Tributaries

Salmon/Steelhead

Cowlitz River I-5 Br downstream – 33 bank rods kept two steelhead and released one steelhead. 1 boat/1 rod had no catch.

Cowlitz River Above the I-5 Br – 28 bank rods kept five steelhead and released one steelhead. 11 boats/34 rods kept 25 steelhead and released one steelhead.

Kalama River – No report.

Lewis River – Five bank rods had no catch. 1 boat/2 rods had no catch.
