## RE: Bureau of Indian Affairs Branch of Tribal Community Resilience – Invasive European Green Crab Funding Awards

Mr. Davis,

This letter is to convey strong support for the U.S Bureau of Indian Affairs' (BIA) efforts and funding to address invasive European green crab (*Carcinus maenas*) in nearshore marine and estuarine ecosystems in the BIA's Northwest and Alaska Regions. European green crabs pose an immediate threat to tribal culture and economies, as well as trust and treaty resources. It is our understanding that awards supporting initiatives that will protect tribal fishing and shellfishing businesses and restore high-quality habitat for native species have been frozen.

In 2024, BIA was provided \$5 million in Tribal Community Resilience funding to address European green crab through the BIA Northwest Region and Alaska Region programs. Of that total, \$500,000 was directed to the BIA Alaska Region and BIA Northwest Region sought applications for \$2.4 million to support tribes who have existing European green crab trapping and monitoring programs, and aid Tribes who need to establish these programs.

Applications were collected and ranked, outlining awards for trapping, monitoring, research, habitat restoration and other short or long-term strategic approaches to combat the spread of the invasive species. Projects submitted for consideration focused on alleviating or preventing invasive European green crab impacts on tribal trust lands, individual Indian allotment lands, or in areas managed by tribes through treaties or agreements.

This frozen funding is critically important to successfully address this shared problem at regional scales and we respectfully request proceeding.
