

These fiscal year priorities build on each other over a four-year investment, delivering the full suite of protection, recovery, and restoration priorities identified in the request. There is flexibility to shift priority work up depending on the levels of

funding received within the final budget.





 Implement known threatened and endangered species recovery actions including supporting partner actions with pass-through

#### Improved protection of

· Recovery projects for pygmy rabbits, western pond turtles, northern leopard frog, Taylor's checkerspot butterfly, island marble butterfly, and sharp-tailed grouse · Pass-through funding to our partners to continue pinto abalone and Olympia oyster recovery

Finalize initial guidance products and expand technical assistance support to second round

· Expand focus on imperiled species recovery plan development and implementation of conservation actions that have not yet begun Support partnerships, public engagement, and conservation

#### education Examples

- · Increasing recovery actions for listed species such as eulachon, bull trout and lamprey · Pass-through funding to University
- and determine management actions for newly listed Cascade red fox . Bring fish and wildlife protection priorities into the second round of comprehensive plan updates in Clark, Lewis, Thurston, Mason, Jefferson, and Clallam counties

Expanded capacity to assess status and threats of unlisted Species of **Greatest Conservation Need** (both fish and wildlife species) and incorporate that knowledge into conservation planning and guidance documents to minimize new listings

Increased restoration capacity for watershed health including an emphasis on terrestrial habitat conditions and climate resiliency

Expand scientific knowledge for species and ecosystem protection and restoration

#### Examples

· Pass through funding to WSU to assess jackrabbit distribution in shrubsteppe habitats with camera traps and other assessment methods · Pass through funding to Xerces and other invertebrate conservation partners to assess status, threats, and conservation actions for terrestrial invertebrate SGCN including pollinators

. Identify and design projects that restore native forest cover near major wildlife crossings



**Expanding habitat** restoration efforts (with an increased emphasis on terrestrial ecosystems) and species and habitat status and threats work

Goals: Vastly expand and improve the effectiveness of habitat protection and restoration efforts. implement species recovery actions, and increase our knowledge about Species of **Greatest Conservation** Need (SGCN) populations to

- 1. Increase the scope and scale of biodiversity recovery in Washington
- Prevent the need for future listings under the federal Endangered Species Act
- 3. Provide scientific feedback to influence habitat protection and restoration and recovery efforts








