Commissioner Schmitten moved, seconded by Vice Chair Douvia, to adopt the revised draft Columbia River Basin Salmon Management Policy with the following changes: Spring Chinook Salmon Item 3:

- In 2013 the Department shall assign 65% of the ESA-impact for upriver spring Chinook stocks to mainstem recreational fisheries. Assign the balance (35%) to off-channel and mainstem commercial fisheries.
- During 2014-16, the Department shall assign 70% of the ESA-impact for upriver spring Chinook stocks to mainstem recreational fisheries. Assign the balance (30%) to off-channel and mainstem commercial fisheries.

• The Recreational-Commercial allocation beginning in 2017 will be determined following additional discussions with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.
