
Willamette Valley–Puget Trough–Georgia Basin ECOREGIONAL ASSESSMENT




ID'ing Statewide Priority Landscapes

Priority Landscape Uses









JBLM ACUB: Original Status 2006

JBLM ACUB: Future Vision



















- WDFW and WDNR with USFWS - Sage Grouse CCAA
- BLM Nomination of Healthy Lands Focal Area
- Informs mitigation discussions such as Vantage to Pomona

Next Steps

- Cross-program team prioritization (Nov-Feb)
- Engage with key stakeholders (February- March)
- Finalize overall approach (April)
- Integrate Priority Landscapes into:
 - State Wildlife Action Plan (January June)
 - Place-based collaborations
 - Develop Teams (on-going)
- Integrate into On-going Work:
 e.g. Align with Lands 20/20 process
