# 2015 Proposal Timeline



- June 9 –draft proposal submitted
- June 17 EMT review
- August 7 FWC review
- August 21 FWC approval
- September 18 submit to OFM/GOV (with fiscal impacts)
- October 2– submit to OFM/GOV (without fiscal impacts)

# Context for the 2016 Session



- Supplemental budget year
- 60-day "short session"
- Typical requests include:
  - Emergencies
  - Emergent issues
  - Technical changes
- Bills that did not pass are retained for the following short session
- Special session(s) possible

## 2016 Agency-Request Summary



- 1. Steelhead License Plate
- 2. Unlawful Hunting Wild Birds
- 3. Wild Salmon Definition
- 4. Fish & Shellfish Records
- 5. Criminal Wildlife Penalty License Suspensions

## Steelhead License Plate



### Problem:

 Additional funding is needed to support key conservation activities for Washington's iconic state fish.

## Proposed Solution:

- Create a new steelhead background license plate to serve as ongoing funding for:
  - Steelhead stock assessments,
  - Evaluations of fishery impacts, and
  - Studies to understand interactions between wild and hatchery steelhead.

# Unlawful Hunting Wild Birds



### Problem:

 A loophole exists in statute where it is unclear that hunters are required to purchase a turkey tag in addition to their small game license.

## Proposed Solution:

 A technical amendment to RCW 77.15.400(1) to align with other license regulations that would require the purchase of a turkey tag with the small game license to prevent violators from escaping penalties.

## Wild Salmon Definition



#### Problem:

 "Wild salmon" is defined as "a salmon with an unclipped adipose fin" and does not take into account when a person clips the adipose fin postharvest to cover unlawful take.

## Proposed Solution:

• A technical amendment to RCW 77.15.370(1)(g) to close a loophole and clarify that any salmon without a healed scar at the adipose fin would also be considered wild salmon.

## Fish & Shellfish Records



### Problem:

 Seafood traceability is challenging and falsification of records can occur when fish and shellfish records are in a separate location from the product.

## Proposed Solution:

 A technical amendment to RCW 77.15.568(1)(c) that requires records remain with fish or shellfish at all times until they are no longer in possession of fish receiver.

# Criminal Wildlife Penalty License Suspensions



### Problem:

 Current statute has been misinterpreted to mean if a criminal wildlife penalty assessment is paid than and individual will not face a license suspension for their violation.

## Proposed Solution:

 Technical amendment to RCW 77.15.420(6) to clarify that hunting license suspensions is in addition to a criminal wildlife penalty.
