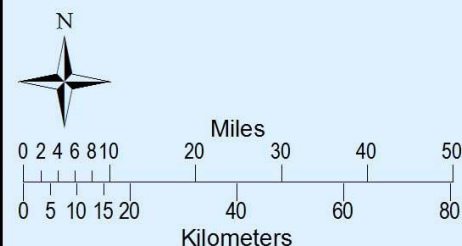

COMMERCIAL LICENSE REVOCATION

On the books but there has never been a committee established by the commission.

- **RCW 77.15.554**
- **License suspension review committee.**
- (1) The license suspension review committee is created. The license suspension review committee may only hear appeals from commercial fishers who have had a license revoked or suspended pursuant to RCW 77.15.552.

Steps taken to address the problem:

- Contacted license holders who are willing to sit on the review committee
- Draft Roberts Rules of Order for committee guidance
- Project is nearing completion

OFFICER INITIATED PROJECT- I1401 K-9 PROGRAM

Project Initiative

Establish a canine (K9) program to enhance the ability to detect evidence relating to unlawful trafficking in wildlife, in addition to detecting other criminal evidence and invasive species. This initiative has a link to five of the nine strategic objectives; (1) Illegal take and trafficking of fish and wildlife is prevented, (2) Threatened and endangered species are protected, (3) Introduction and spread of invasive species is prevented, (4) Fish and wildlife habitat/public lands are protected, and (5) Program profile and connection with the public is increased.

Background

In November 2015 public initiative 1401 was on the ballot. This initiative proposed a new state law regarding illegal trafficking in 10 species threatened with extinction. This initiative had overwhelming support from the voting public and was passed into law with 71% of the vote. Washington is the first state to successfully ask voters to create new penalties under state law for those trafficking in products from 10 endangered species. RCW 77.15.135 went into effect in January 2016, with WDFW being responsible to enforce it. California, New York, and New Jersey, also have current law restricting the sale of ivory, and many more states are introducing bills.

Trafficking in endangered species is a worldwide problem and the United States is the second largest importer. Over the past few decades the demand for products from endangered species has increased, particularly in Asia and North America. This demand drives the poaching of endangered species. Recently it has been determined that the illegal trade in elephant ivory is the fourth largest transnational organized crime in the world and is often tied to terrorist organizations.
