- Projects \$25K to \$1M
- Complete in one biennium
- Small improvements, renovations and upgrades

Hatchery Improvements

- Reduce hazardous working conditions for staff
- Handle fish safely and efficiently
- Help maintain genetic integrity
- Allow wild fish to return to the river safely
- Includes
 - Soos Creek Hatchery
 - Wallace River Hatchery
 - Spokane Hatchery
 - Naselle Hatchery
 - Hoodsport Hatchery
 - Fallert Creek Hatchery

- Puyallup Hatchery
- Eells Springs Hatchery
- Marblemount Hatchery
- Kalama Falls Hatchery
- Deschutes Watershed Center

Intake Renovations

- These projects allow the Department to comply with:
 - Co-managers Salmonid Disease Control Policy Obligations
 - Fish Passage Screening Criteria
 - Hatchery Reform Goals
 - Condition of HGMP
- Includes:
 - Wallace River Hatchery
 - Minter Creek Hatchery
 - Dungeness Hatchery
 - Samish Hatchery
 - Forks Creek Hatchery

Wooten Wildlife Area Floodplain Improvements

- Enable the Department to reverse the deteriorating condition of the Tucannon Lakes and infrastructure
 - Enhances fishing, camping and other recreational opportunities
 - Improves habitat for fish and wildlife
 - Reduces the impact to the floodplain
- Habitat Enhancement funded by BPA (\$1.3M/yr for 5 years)



Snow Creek Access Site, Reconstruct Facilities

- Repairs to substandard rail launch, deteriorated pier and floating dock system
- Provides fishing access in Neah Bay
- Extend useful life of facilities
- Pre-Design to determine best value alternatives



Hazard Fuel Reductions Forest Health Statewide

- Reduce fire risk through fuels reduction, thinning and use of prescribed fire in Eastern WA wildlife areas
 - 10,00 acres annually
- Restores unhealthy dry forests
- Reduces insect and disease problems
- Reduces elevated risks to life and prope
- Improve habitat quality
- Improve recreational opportunities
- In accordance with Wildlife Area Management Plans



Cooperative Deer & Elk Damaged Fencing

- Replace 6 miles of deer and elk control fence
- Cost share program with private landowners
- Crop protection of private agricultural lands
- Sites located in Regions 2, 3 5 and 6



Grants

- Lake Rufus Woods Fishing Access \$1M
 - Pass through grant to Colville Tribe for boating access site
 - MOA in support of Columbia River Water Management Program
- Puget Sound Nearshore Ecosystem Restoration Project (PSNERP) - \$3.3M
 - Cost share with Army Corps of Engineers
 - Complete design with ACOE (65%) and WDFW (35%)
 - Duckabush Estuary site (Jefferson County)
- Fish Barrier Removal Board \$30M
 - Statewide approach to removing barriers and restoring passage
 - 100+ barrier removal projects identified
