#### **Summary**

#### **Background summary:**

The WAC Overhaul Project (recodification) was begun several years ago to update, reorganize and streamline the department's administrative code in WAC Titles 220 and 232 based on ongoing recommendations and complaints from department staff and the public. This was an inter-agency effort that involved review and collaboration from all programs and designated staff including the public. There are no substantive changes made to WAC provisions; there are only technical changes to the provisions.

The technical changes are in five categories: changes to headings in WAC sections (92), corrections to internal WAC references based on the Code's new numbering system (less than 200), corrections to RCW references that are invalid (7), corrections to references of outdated state agencies (4) and corrections to misspellings (2).

#### Policy issue(s) you are bringing to the Commission for consideration:

The proposal combines Titles 220 and 232 and reorganizes and restructures the Code to make it easier for the public and staff to navigate. No policy changes were made to the rules; the changes are only technical in nature.

#### Public involvement process used and what you learned:

There have been several public hearings in past years updating the Commission and the public on technical changes made under this proposal. The public has been supportive of the recodification. WDFW also sent notifications of proposed rule changes to members of the public who expressed interest in being notified of proposed rule changes under this proposal.

#### **Action requested:**

Requesting the approval and adoption of the WAC recodification.

#### **Draft motion language:**

Move to approve the recodification outline of WAC Titles 220 and 232 and technical changes to WAC sections therein as presented by staff.

#### **Justification for Commission action:**

Rule language is supposed to be efficient, clear, legally adequate, and accurate. The proposed amendments are in accordance with and will promote these goals while avoiding changes to the underlying meaning of the rules. The reorganization of rules in this proposal will promote the clarity and efficiency of WDFW's administrative code.

This action is further justified under RCW 77.12.047.

#### **Communications Plan:**

Once the proposal is adopted, the department will be posting an update to the public on its webpage that provides a "cross-walk" of old to new WAC provisions and the outline of the newly organized Code. In addition, any WAC references in the annual fishing and hunting pamphlets will reflect the new numbering system under the WAC recodification. The department will also update the legislative links to its WAC provisions that are currently located on its website.
