

Bering Sea 2017 Groundfish Stock Status



- Total ABC is 4.01 million metric tons for 2017.
- Pollock ABC is 2.8 mmt
- 2015 Groundfish ex-vessel value is \$894 million, 52% of total AK value.
- Ecosystem considerations 2014-2016 were anomalously warm. Many ecosystem indicators show declining productivity.

Halibut Bycatch Management

- Halibut Management Framework adopted a year ago, provides policy direction and a work plan. Objectives include improved management coordination with IPHC.
- Abundance based approach In early development, held a public session at the February meeting.
- Industry measures Amendment 80 cooperative agreements, covered all participants. Appeared successful in first year.
- Deck Sorting In developmental stage, although about half of Am 80 vessels are participating. Continual progress, trying to reduce expenses.


- Amendment 80 sector showed a 32% reduction from 2011-2015 average
- 2016 mortality rate in groundfish fisheries was 1.2kg of halibut per metric ton of groundfish, or about 0.012% of the catch.
- Total Bering Sea groundfish harvest in 2016 was 1.935 million metric tons.

Electronic monitoring tools for onboard catch and bycatch estimation

- Adopted tools for over 40' vessels fishing hook and line or pots
- Costs are decreasing
- Data storage and analysis still to be determined
- Broad applicability to other small boat fleets
- NFWF support in development







Recreational Quota Entity

- Innovative approach to reallocation, using a marketbased, compensated reallocation approach.
- RQE purchases quota from willing sellers, and holds quota on behalf of entire charter halibut fishery
- Objective is to stabilize recreational fishery at lower levels of abundance.
