2017-19 CHALLENGING BUDGET ENVIRONMENT

- Expenses continue to outpace revenue in the nonrestricted State Wildlife Account and spending authority must be decreased this biennium.
- Opportunity to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of agency operations and stakeholder/customer awareness of the challenges facing our conservation mandate.
- Budget shortfall was partially addressed with one-time funding.
- Difficult decisions need to be made about program reductions and agency priorities.



PROPOSAL DEVELOPMENT TIMELINE






ADA STATUTE CHANGES

Streamlines legislative direction and consolidates statues

- Provides Commission authority to promulgate rules to establish eligibility criteria for persons with disabilities. (RCW 77.32.237)
- Provides Commission authority to regulate the conduct of persons with disabilities and their companions. (RCW 77.32.237)
- Repeals statutes that are in conflict with other state statutes regarding medical signature authority.



INCREASE FISHING AND HUNTING PARTICIPATION



Recruitment, Retention & Reactivation

- Aligns the definition of youth to under 16 for both hunting and fishing.
- Provides \$20 discount to hunter education graduates on their first hunting license purchase.
- Provides additional authority for the Department to create bundled license packages, multi-year license packages and offer promotional pricing.
- Removes the restriction that prohibits temporary fishing combination licenses during the popular lowland lakes fishing opener.
