Background summary:

Department staff members will brief the Commission on the Periodic Status Reviews compiled for the Yellow-billed Cuckoo and Loggerhead Sea Turtle in accordance with WAC 220-200-100. These Periodic Status Reviews outline the current status of the species and include information and comments provided by peer scientists and the public. Staff will provide their recommendations to the Commission to reclassify these species.

Policy issue(s) you are bringing to the Commission for consideration:

- Protect and conserve Washington's native wildlife.
- Continue recovery actions for these state-listed species.

Public involvement process used and what you learned:

The agency sent out a press release and launched a website to solicit information from the public to be included in the Periodic Status Reviews. In accordance with WAC regulations, individuals and organizations had one year to contribute information for the reviews. Staff included this information, as applicable, in the status review documents. The documents were then reviewed by WDFW staff and external species experts before a 90-day public comment period and a concurrent SEPA 90-day comment period began on the document and our findings. The comments were collated, responded to, and included in the final Periodic Status Reviews.

Action requested:

Amend WAC 220-200-100 and 220-610-010 as presented by the Department.

Draft motion language:

I move to amend WAC 220-200-100 and 220-610-010 as presented by the Department.

Justification for Commission action:

Conserve and recover Washington's state-listed species.

AMENDATORY SECTION (Amending WSR 17-05-112, filed 2/15/17, effective 3/18/17)

WAC 220-200-100 Wildlife classified as protected shall not be hunted or fished. Protected wildlife are designated into three subcategories: Threatened, sensitive, and other.

Rationale: The changes in taxonomy to sage-grouse, gray whale, golden-mantled ground squirrel, and Washington ground squirrel, have been accepted by the scientific community. Additionally, these authorities have recently split the northern flying squirrel into the northern flying squirrel and the Humboldt's flying squirrel. The scientific names for sharptailed grouse and the chipmunks were incorrect.

In addition, the proposal will classify the yellow-billed cuckoo as state endangered (WAC 220-610-010).		
Reasons supporting proposal: The department has reviewed all relevant data pertaining to the population status of loggerhead sea turtle and yellow-billed cuckoo in Washington.		
Loggerhead sea turtles in Washington are part of the North Pacific population, which migrate from nesting sites near Japan to waters off the west coast of North America. Loggerhead sea turtles are rarely seen in Washington. The North Pacific population of loggerhead sea turtles declined substantially in the last half of the 20th century. Threats to these turtles include harvest by humans, incidental capture in fisheries, and damage to nesting habitat.		
Just 20 sightings of yellow-billed cuckoos have been documented in Washington since the 1950s and were likely non-breeding vagrants or migrants, indicating that cuckoos are now functionally extirpated in the state. Nevertheless, due to a lack of surveys and the presence potential habitat in Washington, the possibility exists that this species may occasionally breed in the state and that these rare breeders are yet to be discovered.		
The greatest threats to western yellow-billed cuckoos is the loss or degradation of riparian habitats caused by dam construction, flood control practices, commercial and residential development, changes in farming and ranching practices, and nonnative plant invasions. Agricultural pesticide use, which may affect prey abundance as well as the birds' health, is a potential additional threat.
