Commissioner Thorburn provided an overview of the discussions at the Wolf Advisory Committee. Commissioner Thorburn was elected chair. Processes for agendas and record keeping were discussed. The meetings will be open to the public but there will be no testimony. Meetings will not necessarily be scheduled with regular commission meetings. The timelines for the SEPA processes for the wolf periodic status review (PSR), wolf de-listing plan, wolf translocation, and wolves and grazing on department lands were discussed along with potential policy-level decisions during these processes that the committee will evaluate for bringing recommendations to the full commission. Commissioner Thorburn emphasized that wolf status in the PSR will be evaluated by both de-listing criteria in WAC 220-610-110: no longer in danger of failing, declining or...vulnerable...to limited numbers, disease, predation, exploitation, or habitat loss or change OR meeting of recovery plan goals.

Commissioner Thorburn also provided a brief update on the Wildlife Committee meeting.

# 20. <u>Columbia River Policy Review – Joint WA/OR Committee Update, Public Input, and Possible Decision</u>

Committee members Don McIsaac, David Graybill and Bob Kehoe along with Bill Tweit, Special Assistant and Ryan Lothrop, Columbia River Fishery Manager provided the Commission an update on the progress from the recommendation of the Joint WA/OR Columbia River Policy Review Committee for 2019 concurrent policies and regulations, as needed for the onset of the 2019 North of Falcon Process.

Commissioner Kehoe moved, seconded by Commissioner Thorburn to adopt the Policy Review Committee's recommendation as displayed on slide 7 (see below). The details of Option 1 are shown in the "Transmission Document" from the Policy Review Committee. Commissioners Holzmiller, Baker, Kehoe, Thorburn and McIsaac voted in favor of the motion, Commissioner Graybill voted against the motion, Commissioners Smith and Carpenter abstained from the vote. The motion passed.

Option 1 – Transition Period with amendment for Spring Chinook

Transition Period refers to all the allocations and gear types allowed in 2016. Last year moving from gillnets to alternative gear. Change from mandatory barbless hooks to voluntary barbless hooks effective as soon as practical but by June 1, 2019 at the latest.

Good faith progress toward recommending a comprehensive Columbia River salmon fishery policy for 2020 and beyond, to be completed as soon as possible. The policies embodied in this motion are intended to be on place until such comprehensive policy is adopted.

To be used only in 2019, the motion is amended such that the 80%/20% sport/commercial allocation, with no buffer applied to the commercial share an no mainstem commercial fishing, is to be used unless the Upriver run size update is more than 129% of the Upriver spring Chinook pre-season forecast of 99,300.
