Background summary:

The illegal introduction of Yellow Perch into Pass Lake (Skagit County) is having a detrimental effect on a popular fly fishing only trout fishery. Allowing retention of fish would help control the populations which compete with trout for food and space. Pass Lake (Skagit County) is managed for the trout fishery by planting small young fish in the lake that grow to be fished on the next year.

Staff recommendation:

Adopt sport fishing rules to allow retention all gamefish under statewide general rules, except trout must be released.

Policy issue(s) and expected outcome:

Outreach to fly fishing clubs indicates they were supportive of this sport fishing rule change.

Fiscal impacts of agency implementation:

none

Public involvement process used and what you learned:

Presented findings to three local fly fishing clubs and discussed rule proposal. Some concern was raised that allowing harvest of Yellow Perch may be considered a reward to those who introduced them. However, they do understand that permitting harvest in a water that was previously catch-and-release of all species allows anglers to assist WDFW in suppressing this population and communicates to others that Yellow Perch are not desired in this fishery.

Action requested and/or proposed next steps:

Adopt this rule change and include in the sport fishing rules pamphlet July 2019-June 2020
