Friday, August 11, 2023

1. Call to Order

a. Commissioners' Discussion

Chair Baker called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

Commissioner Anderson talked about this summer's fish and wildlife adventures.

Commissioner Ragen mentioned he met with John Dykes and Dane Czarnecki to talk about conservation and carnivore management. Chair Baker also had a conversation with Mr. Czarnecki.

Chair Baker and Commissioner Lehmkuhl provided a report from their recent attendance at the Western Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (WAFWA). WAFWA will be hosted in Washington in 2024. Chair Baker suggested that she would like to see more time for Commissioners and Directors to connect at the conference.

Joe Panesko, the agency's attorney provided the Commission with an update on active public litigation.

Big Tent Committee

Chair Baker reported that the committee was provided a <u>Communications and Public Engagement</u> (<u>C.A.P.E.</u>) <u>overview</u> The staff provided a <u>summary and the comments</u> of the draft Conservation Policy open comment period. The draft policy can be reviewed <u>here</u>. Commissioner Lehmkuhl asked about the status of the science-policy interface. Deputy Director Windrope reiterated the <u>timeline</u>. Chair Baker suggested a document working group. Commissioners Smith and Ragen volunteered to participate.

Wildlife Committee

Donny Martorello discussed the science-policy framework of bear and cougar management and asked for committee feedback. Committee members provided some questions and others will provide their questions via email. The committee was also given a briefing on the status of Avian Flu in Washington State.

Fish Committee

Commissioner Anderson reported that the committee was provided an update on the progress of
the <u>Co-Manager Hatchery Policy</u>, a status update on the <u>OP Steelhead Federal Listing</u>, the Saturday
presentation on the Willapa Bay Draft Policy, an overview of the <u>Management Strategy Evaluation</u>
approach blue sheet, and discussed several items for future meeting planning.

Habitat Committee

Committee members in attendance: Linville, Lehmkuhl, Ragen, Myers The committee was provided a Fish Passage and Screening Rulemaking update.

Chair Baker reported that at the last Executive committee meeting the committee was asked by staff to provide a recommendation to the full commission on the following. The Executive committee supported the recommendation by staff.

WDFW is building an electronic licensing mobile application which will allow recreational hunters and anglers to carry and display their licenses on their mobile device, submit catch record cards, harvest reports, and access their licensing and harvest information. In addition, functionality is being added to the existing Fish WA regulations application for anglers to submit catch record cards and display their active privileges. In order to implement the mobile application, there are administrative changes to the WAC needed. The current WAC's describe a paper process, and we need to update the WACS to reflect digital licensing and reporting. The Executive Committee discussed this and the agency's recommendation that the Commission delegate this administrative rulemaking to the Director and we support delegation. The WACs listed on screen are impacted by the development of these applications.
