The Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission convened for a virtual Special Hatchery Workshop regarding Risks and Benefits of Hatchery Production

This workshop provided a detailed discussion of hatchery production risks and benefits in general, and as they relate to efforts to increase prey for SRKW, and to the two hatchery policy alternatives (C-3624 and draft Co-Manager Hatchery Policy).

- 4. What risks does the Commission's 2018 Prey Initiative identify and what protections does it propose or provide from adverse effects on wild Chinook salmon populations?
- 5. Comparison between C-3624 and the draft Co-Manager Hatchery Policy
