### NEW SECTION

### WAC 232-28-61900B Exceptions to statewide rules—Lewis River.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 232-28-619, effective February 17, 2014, until further notice, it is unlawful to violate the following provisions, provided that unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect:

- (1) Chinook salmon must be released in waters of the Lewis River from the mouth to the mouth of East Fork.
- (2) Chinook salmon must be released in waters of the North Fork Lewis River from the mouth of East Fork to the overhead powerlines below Merwin Dam.
- (3) Through May 31, 2014, fishing is closed to all angling on the North Fork Lewis River from Johnson Creek (located downstream from the Lewis River Salmon Hatchery) upstream to Merwin Dam.

#### **EMERGENCY RULE ONLY**

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
