NEW SECTION

WAC 232-28-62100Z Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 232-28-621, effective February 10 through April 15, 2014, it is unlawful to violate the provisions below. Unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect:

All waters of Catch Record Card Area 9, excluding Edmonds Public Fishing Pier: Daily limit 1 salmon; release wild Chinook.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective 12:01 a.m. April 16, 2014:

WAC 232-28-62100Z Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

Reasons for this finding: Preliminary estimates indicate that the encounters of legal size Chinook in Area 9 are projected to exceed the pre-season expectations. This regulation reduces the retention of salmon in Area 9 to a daily limit of one in order to minimize encounters of legal size hatchery and wild Chinook and ensure compliance with conservation objectives and agreed-to management plans. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules. **(14-29, 2/7/2014)**

⁽x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
