WAC 220-310-18000B Exceptions to statewide rules—Bowers Lake (Vance Creek Pond #1) Grays Harbor Co.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, effective April 5 through April 13, 2014, juveniles, holders of a senior license, and anglers with Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife disability status and who have a designated harvester card may fish in those waters of Bowers Lake (Vance Creek Pond #1).
