EMERGENCY RULE

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal year 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: This rule change is necessary to ensure a safe and successful event. The fish will be planted one day prior to the event to better acclimate them before the event. Fish will be placed into netted areas along the shoreline of the pond. On the days of the event, pre-registered kids will be allowed to fish within these netted areas. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-18500E Exceptions to statewide rules—Klineline Pond (Clark Co.)

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-185, effective 12:01 a.m. April 10 through April 12, 2014, it is unlawful to fish in those waters of Klineline Pond, except as provided in this section:

- (1) Open to fishing 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. April 11 and 12, 2014, in the netted area, to juvenile anglers participating in the Klineline Kids Fishing Event.
- (2) Daily limit of two fish.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective April 13, 2014:

WAC 220-310-18500E Exceptions to statewide rules—Klineline Pond (Clark Co.)

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:
