NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-18000C Freshwater Exceptions to Statewide Rules—Chehalis, Hoh and Sol Duc Rivers.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, effective May 1, 2014, until further notice, it is unlawful to violate the following provisions, provided that unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect:

(1) Chehalis River (Grays Harbor, Thurston, and Lewis counties):

From the confluence with the Skookumchuck River to the Highway 6 Bridge in town of Adna: Salmon: Open May 1 through June 30, 2014. Daily limit one fish.

(2) Hoh River (Jefferson Co.):

(a) From the Olympic National Park boundary upstream to the DNR Oxbow Campground Boat Launch:

- (i) All Game Fish: Closed through June 6.
- (ii) Salmon: Closed May 1, 2014, until further notice.

(b) From the DNR Oxbow Campground Boat Launch to Willoughby Creek:

- (i) All Game Fish: Closed through June 6.
- (ii) Salmon: Closed May 1, 2014, until further notice.

(3) Sol Duc River (Clallam Co.):

From the Sol Duc Hatchery outlet creek upstream to the old trestle pilings: Salmon: Closed May 1, 2014, until further notice.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY
