NEW SECTION

WAC 220-52-03000P Commercial Razor clams.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-52-030, effective 12:01 a.m. May 1, 2014, through 11:59 p.m. July 2, 2014, a person may dig for and possess razor clams for commercial purposes only in those waters and detached beaches of Razor Clam Area 2 lying south of the Willapa Bay Ship Channel, west of Ellen Sands, and north of the tip of Leadbetter Point.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective 12:01 a.m. July 3, 2014:

WAC 220-52-03000P Commercial Razor Clams.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

(x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.

() That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Based on historical catches and on site inspection, there should be adequate razor clams to support an eight-week commercial season. Biotoxin levels currently fall below the regulatory threshold. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules. (14-89, 4/25/2014)
