Reasons for this finding: The 2014 State/Tribal Shrimp Harvest Management Plans for the Strait of Juan de Fuca and Puget Sound require adoption of harvest seasons contained in this emergency rule. This emergency rule (1) Closes Shrimp Management Area 1C: and (2) Implements a spot shrimp weekly limit of 300 pounds in Shrimp Management Area 1A and Catch Areas 23A-C/23B and then closes those areas on September 2. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-52-05100W Puget Sound shrimp pot and beam trawl fishery—season.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-52-051, effective immediately until further notice, it is unlawful to fish for shrimp for commercial purposes in Puget Sound except as provided for in this section:

(1) Shrimp pot gear:

- (a) All waters of Shrimp Management Areas 1A, 2W, 3, 4, 5 and 6 are open to the harvest of all shrimp species, except:
 - (i) All waters of Shrimp Management Area 1C and the Discovery Bay Shrimp District are closed.
 - (ii) All waters of Shrimp Management Areas 2W, 4, 6 and Catch Areas 23A-E and 25A are closed to the harvest of spot shrimp.
- (iii) Effective immediately, until 11:59 p.m. September 2, 2014, all waters of Shrimp Management Area 1A are closed to the harvest of all species other than spot shrimp.
- (b) Effective 11:59 p.m. September 2, 2014, all waters of Shrimp Management Area 1A are closed.
- (c) Effective 11:59 p.m. September 2, 2014, all waters of Catch Areas 23A-C/23B are closed to the harvest of spot shrimp.
- (d) The spot shrimp catch accounting week is Wednesday through Tuesday.
- (e) It is unlawful for the combined total harvest of spot shrimp by a fisher and/or the fisher's alternate operator to exceed 600 pounds per week with the following exceptions:
- (i) Effective immediately, until 11:59 p.m. September 2, 2014, it is unlawful for the harvest by a fisher and/or the fisher's alternate operator to exceed 300 pounds in Shrimp Management Area 1A or to exceed 300 pounds in Catch Areas 23A-C/23B.
- (f) It is unlawful to pull shellfish pots in more than one catch area per day.
- (g) Only pots with a minimum mesh size of 1 inch may be pulled on calendar days when fishing for or retaining spot shrimp. Mesh size of 1 inch is defined as a mesh opening that a 7/8-inch square peg will pass through, excluding the entrance tunnels, except for flexible (web) mesh pots, where the mesh must be a minimum of 1¾-inch stretch measure. Stretch measure is defined as the distance between the inside of one knot to the outside of the opposite vertical knot of one mesh, when the mesh is stretched vertically.
- (2) Shrimp beam trawl gear:
 - (a) Shrimp Management Area (SMA)
 - 3 (outside of the Discovery Bay Shrimp District, Sequim Bay and Catch Area 23D) is open. Sequim Bay includes those waters of Catch Area 25A south of a line projected west from Travis Spit on the Miller Peninsula.
 - (b) Those portions of Catch Areas 20B, 21A and 22A within SMA 1B are open.
 - (c) All waters of Catch Area 20A are open.
- (3) All shrimp taken under this section must be sold to licensed Washington wholesale fish dealers.

REPEALER
