## NEW SECTION

## WAC 232-28-62000H Coastal salmon —saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 232-28-620, effective September 1 through September 30, 2014, it is unlawful to violate the provisions below. Unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect:

(1) **Catch Record Card Area 1:** Open until further notice: Daily limit of 2 salmon, of which not more than one may be a Chinook salmon, release wild coho.

(2) Catch Record Card Area 2: Open until further notice: Daily limit of 2 salmon.

(3) Catch Record Card Area 3: Open until further notice: daily limit of 2 salmon.

(4) **Catch Record Card Area 4:** Open until further notice: daily limit of 2 salmon. Waters east of the Bonilla – Tatoosh line - release Chinook. Waters south of a line from Kydaka Point to Shipwreck Point are closed.

REPEALERS

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective September 1, 2014:

WAC 232-28-62000G Coastal salmon —saltwater seasons and daily limits. (14209)

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective October 1, 2014:
