### NEW SECTION

## WAC 220-310-18000E Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, effective immediately through November 30, 2014, anglers may retain one additional adult hatchery Chinook as part of the daily limit in those waters of the North Nemah River from the Highway 101 Bridge upstream to the bridge on Nemah Valley Road.

### REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective December 1, 2014

WAC 220-310-18000E Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal.

#### EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Sufficient abundance of hatchery-origin Chinook are available for harvest in the Nemah river system. Increasing the daily limit of adult salmon will provide additional angling opportunity.
