### REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed:

WAC 220-40-02700V Willapa Bay fall fishery. (14-251)

#### EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, or
- 2011, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

**Reasons for this finding**: The commercial fisherman has declined to participate in the one day research project which was authorized to collect information on wild to hatchery ratio and stock composition of Chinook salmon in the area with the highest production of hatchery Chinook, the Nemah River, therefore an emergency rule is needed to close this fishery. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
