### NEW SECTION

## WAC 220-310-19000F Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Nisqually River.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-190, effective September 22, 2014, until further notice, it is unlawful to retain Chinook salmon as part of the daily limit in waters of the Nisqually River downstream of the military tank crossing; and closed waters from 100 yards downstream to 100 yards upstream of both Clear Creek and Kalama Creek. Daily limit 6, of which only 2 may be adult salmon. Release Chinook.

### EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

**Reason for finding:** An emergency rule is needed to close Chinook retention as the abundance is down substantially from pre-season forecasts, and hatchery egg take may not be attained. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
