NEW SECTION

WAC 220-40-02700W Salmon—Willapa Bay fall fishery.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-47-027: Effective 12:00 p.m. September 21, 2014 through 12:00 p.m. September 22, 2014, a person may fish for salmon for commercial purposes in waters of Willapa Bay Catch Areas 2N, 2U, 2T, 2R, and 2M, provided that unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative code is repealed effective 7:01 a.m. September 22, 2014:

WAC 220-40-02700W Willapa Bay Fall fishery.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013 which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: This 24-hour opening was included in the impact analysis and set aside as an incentive for compliance with fish-handling rules developed as part of the 2014 Willapa Bay commercial fishery package. Data collected during on-board monitoring of the 2014 Willapa Bay commercial fishery to date indicate that the overall compliance rate is greater than 90 percent by participants of this fishery. As provided in the Concise Explanatory Statement, this additional day is provided. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules. (14-270, 9/19/2014)
