#### ORDER NO. 14-274

### NEW SECTION

### WAC 220-310-18000G Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, effective September 29 through October 15, 2014, the following waters are closed to fishing:

- (1) **Hoh River:** From Morgan's Crossing boat launch upstream to the Olympic National Park boundary.
- (2) **South Fork Hoh River:** Waters outside the Olympic National Park.

#### REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative code is repealed effective October 16, 2014:

WAC 220-310-18000G Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal.

#### **EMERGENCY RULE ONLY**

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

**Reasons for this finding**: Returns of spring/summer Chinook to the Hoh River have been low for several years, and escapements have consistently been below the floor escapement goal. This closure is needed to protect these Chinook as they stage and spawn in the upper Hoh River. The Olympic National Park has closed the Hoh River to fishing within the Park through October 15, 2014. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
