NEW SECTION

WAC 220-56-33000C Crab-Areas and seasons.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-56-330, effective 8:00 a.m. October 1 through 5:00 p.m. December 31, 2014, it is permissible to fish for crab for personal use seven days a week in Marine Areas 4 east of the Bonilla Tatoosh Line, 5, 6, 7, 8-1, 8-2, 9, 12 and 13.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code will be repealed effective 5:01 p.m. December 31, 2014:

WAC 220-56-33000N Crab—Areas and seasons.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: These rules re-open the recreational crab fishery in the specified marine areas and adjust the open days per week to allow for inclement winter weather. Available harvest shares allow the areas to be opened in this rule. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
