NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-18000K Exceptions to statewide rules—Hoko River.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, effective December 8, 2014, through January 15, 2015, it is unlawful to fish in the waters of the Hoko River from the hatchery fish ladder downstream 100 feet.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective January 16, 2015:

WAC 220-310-18000K Exceptions to statewide rules—Hoko River.

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- (x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- () That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- () That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, or 2011, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Closing the portion of the river near the fish ladder will allow hatchery employees to work safely in the area to provide routine maintenance, and also allow steelhead to aggregate outside the ladder and move up into the facility to ensure egg take requirements are met. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
