WAC 220-310-20000Z Exceptions to statewide rules—Columbia River sturgeon.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-200, effective 12:01 a.m. March 2, 2015, until further notice, it is unlawful to retain sturgeon caught in those waters of the Columbia River and tributaries from Bonneville Dam upstream to The Dalles Dam.
